Still looking for a more permanent solution, and I'm ready to buy more licences if I get it working. Coming back to the initial question with some answers and no solution I have bought a licence for the 3-rd cam which worked well on DS112 box. The same licence worked also on baremetal Xpenology 6.02. Now I have gone over to ESXi based environment and the licence does not activate anymore, giving the 'connection failed' error I have tried SN and MAC pair generated by the excel file available in the net.

I have also tried the original MAC and SN from the DS112, with still the connection failed message at activation the licence. Might be that there are some detection mechanisms for non genuine HW. I also tried to fall back to the oldest possible surveillance station with no success. My workaround: I am running separate Xpenology instance on ESXi for every pair of cameras. Not very convenient as they have separate timelines.

Since I need to buy my licenses why not give a 10 day Trial period? This way I can add 10 or 20 cameras to ensure the device and network infrastructure can handle the load and have a few days to test before I need to buy the license. The software won't even let me setup the camera until I buy the license. At the very least let me complete the install and leave the cameras disabled until I buy the license.

Cons: UPDATE June 25 2017: Synology has added the features I mentioned below! Surveillance Station 8.1 ----- I hope Synology updates the Surveillance Station software to full HTML 5 so that it will work on browsers other than Internet Explorer.

Take Axis F44 for example. Axis F44 (with at most four lenses) provides up to five channels of video stream. The four channels are corresponded to by the four lenses, and the fifth channel is the view of all four cameras combined. If you wish to display all five channels in Surveillance Station, Synology will charge you for five licenses accordingly. Video servers such as Vivotek VS8801 can connect to up to eight analog cameras.

That's why I was curious about the surveillance package as it is quite clearly an 'add-on' synology sell and should be compensated for. Synology's DSM is Linux, with their own proprietary additions (funny thing, they do break GPL with their synobios kernel module!), including the app system, volume system, and the web UI. What we do is take this specifically licensed product (because this together is a product), break that license and ToS, and install it on our hardware. Then we circumvent the protection employed by Synology to make it work (and also we add some extra stuff (kernel drivers for support, mostly).

Mobile App While the desktop application has a lot of great features, the mobile app, called 'DS cam' is lacking all but the most basic functionality. The most common use of the mobile app is to conduct live-viewing of the cameras.

Unfortunately, after installing Surveillance Station, there's no indication that a desktop client even exists. Considering the fact that the program is completely new and the web version doesn't really work well, I'd think this should be more prominently explained to the user. There are versions of the client available for both Windows and Mac (sorry Linux users), and the installation is a basic wizard that's easy to get through.

There's always more to the story. There's always a catch. The catch here is 2 cameras are included but the third one will cost you. The license is more than I spent on the camera! Surveillance Station works well and I thought I had purchased it when I bought my NAS, but I guess I only purchased part of it. If the fee was reasonable, I wouldn't mind so much, but it's excessive. I refuse to buy something both unexpected and excessive.

I've never see anything that indicates that this even applies to old licenses. Have you reached out to Synology for clarification? I guess raging on the forums is more entertaining than doing that, though.

I want by supporting a company the behalves like this! Watch 'valid' owners turn to 'cracks' to get SS to work as per the licence they paid for! Nyknicks8 wrote:So synology does not want users to upgrade diskstations and rather have them switch to a different brand?

UPDATE Synology now limits the licence to ONE device, from the page as of. Froggergolf wrote:Thanks for sharing. I was looking at a rs2146 and 46 more additional licenses if my trial is successful, but this makes one wonder about the support. For a point solution like that, you'll be fine and not run into licence issues, unless you plan on changing the NAS hardware on a regular basis. The SS8 changes more impact home users who may upgrade a bit more often. Ie buy a 2 bay unit, then upgrade to a 4 bay and then a few years later to a faster unit would = blocked licence! Synology email support, while never fast, have always been very helpful and worked to resolve issues I've had over the years.

You pay for what you use. Your average user probably never buys a license.

Load the app, click on the camera you're interested in, and you'll have full control of the camera including panning/tilting and talking through the speaker if the camera supports it, as shown in the center panel of the picture. It works well enough, although there is a slight delay between pushing a button and seeing the results on the screen, even when on the same subnet. The other feature that will get the most use is viewing recordings as shown on the right panel of the above picture.

The Recordings tool is pretty basic: It contains a list of all of the videos that your system has recorded. It first separates them based on date, and then further scales it down into two 12-hour windows.

They replied that the license is tied to the NAS and not the camera. I can swap cameras all I want.

(And yes, the license was bought from more than valid retailer in Germany.) Pure stupidity Synology! I really hope to get good response from support.

It's no secret that I'm a big fan of personal hosting solutions. With data breaches occurring at an ever-increasing rate, having control of your own data is the best solution, and doubly so if you only need to access it from your own home. That's why I love on-site NAS solutions from companies like, and. While these devices are great at storage and offer excellent performance, many of them also offer a great ecosystem of apps that can be installed and managed, extending functionality well past simple storage. Today I'll take a look at Synology's Surveillance Station, a tool that lets you merge multiple IP cameras into a single interface. Surveillance Station has been around for a while, but Synology has recently upgraded it to version 8.0. Arguably one of the best new 'features' of the upgraded version is that there is now a dedicated desktop application that you can install instead of having to use the system through a web browser.

This really sucks. Our small company bought DS411 years ago and a 4 camera license.

If I'm Joe Average homeowner with two or three cameras, then buying my Synology NAS and having it serve as a surveillance system is a bonus. If I'm Fred Businessowner then buying ten licenses plus the hardware is comparable to purchasing a professional grade surveillance system from a vendor. An RS815 + 16 licenses is probably about \$2000 without disks. That's not terribly far off the mark for a professional grade NVR system that probably has similar functionality as the Surveillance Station software. I'm not saying I like it a whole lot, but it makes sense.
